Contest Important Information:

- **Parking** is available across from the William B. Raggio Building in the Whalen Parking Garage. You need to enter from Virginia Street to access the parking garage. Please be mindful of parking signage. Parking that is restricted is monitored 24 hours.
- The Raggio Building **WILL NOT** be open prior to 7:00 a.m. for parents or students.
- All students with exhibits must provide their own extension cords and devices to move their exhibit from the parking lot to the Ballroom in the Student Union.
- Students participating in performances must bring their own props (including desks, chairs, podium, electronic devices, projector, screen, etc...). UNR will not supply any materials or technology.
- All student entries for Historical Papers, Performances, Documentaries, & Websites must check in with a teacher from their school AT LEAST 30 minutes prior to their scheduled time.
- **The Award Ceremony will be held in the Jot Travis Building, room 100.**
- Exhibits must be picked up no later than 1:00 p.m.
- The Northern Nevada contest is also being held on April 8, 2017. First Place winners from both the north and south will be eligible to attend the national contest in Maryland on June 11 – 16, 2017. If a first place winner in Reno decides not to attend the national contest, the second place winner will be given the opportunity to attend.
- All judging decisions are final.

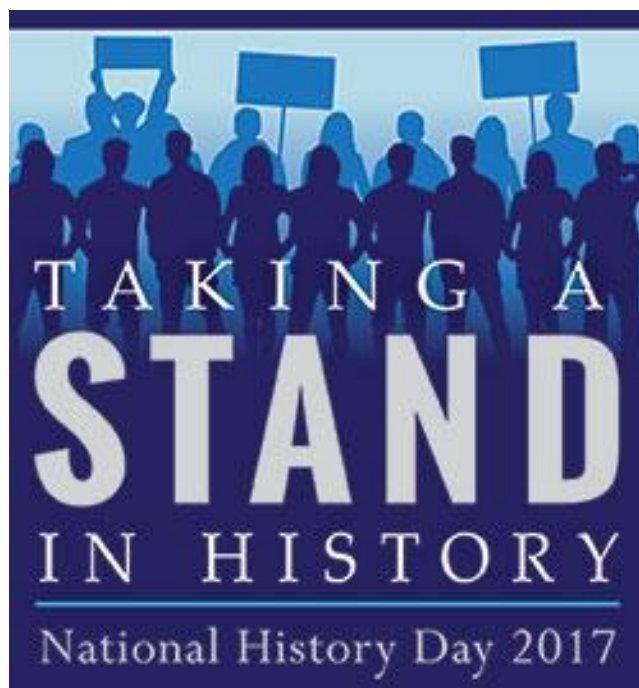
